the eighth-most populous metropolitan area in India.






WIND SPEED




In Kanpur, India, during thentire year, the rain falls for 45.4 days and collects up to 959.5mm (37.78") of precipitation.



It is home to the city's cultural heritage, modern art, music, films, and over a million books, including more than 16,000 from the Japanese occupation period, and of course, is equipped with the latest technologies of a modern library.




BASMENT PLAN

- The children's library with imaginative bookcases and an adjoining patio under the awning for outdoor play is situated below.
- Looking up, you can see the special finish of the awnings: champagne coloured aluminium panels with a linear staggered relief, providing additional decorative elements to the facades.

The library was already a key institution in the diverse community of Kew gardens hills, and it boasts some of the best attendance and circulation figures of any library nationwide. Community members' dedicated advocacy was pivotal in supporting a design that has provided the library with needed facilities and has given it a physical presence in keeping with institution's importance.

The project began as the renovation and 3,000-square-foot expansion of an existing lindsey library from 1966. Its volume is still visible in the completed library. However, structural upgrades and new interior detailing have all but replaced the preexisting building with a new 10,000-square-foot space.

The facade is made from custom glass fiber—reinforced concrete panels. Their rippled, curtain-like pattern of vertical folds creates a play of light and shadow and softens the primarily glassy exterior.













On the north side, the facade descends again, providing privacy for a teen study area while also bridging the difference in scale between the library and its residential surroundings.



The new facade is a physical and metaphoric lifting up of the library's exterior walls in order to broadcast the activities of the library to the outside.



A second, smaller peak at the children's corner provides child-sized views to the south. Between these two peaks, the facade dips down to provide privacy at the staff and book drop areas behind.



Beneath, large exterior windows provide direct light, while natural south- and east-facing windows clerestory provide indirect light that bounces off of the exposed concrete of the lifted facade. Not only expressive and functional but also structural, this concrete band acts as a 200-footlong beam to support the without green roof interrupting the open interior. Two columns are the only supports for this beam.





The focal point of the new design is the public space along the library's perimeter, occupying the setback between the preexisting building's footprint and the sidewalk.

Capped by a green roof, this perimeter zone joins existing gardens around the library's back sides to form a continuous loop of green. Inside. the perimeter zone is conceived as a band of open rooms to be used by each of the library's different user groups: adults, teens, children and staff.







Reading rooms, formal and informal reading spaces, individual carrels, seminar rooms, and administrative offices are accommodated in addition to softer and more flexible functions such as exhibition and presentation spaces.

- Gothic furniture is characterized by ornate, unique artwork that contains the same elements found in gothic architecture. This architectural style is associated with church design, and gothic furniture was created to complement it.
- Specific design characteristics that appear in the furniture are gargoyles, flying buttresses, and quatrefoil and trefoil shapes. Pointed arches, tracery, heavy fabrics, and heavy woods are some other characteristics of this type of furniture.









POINTED ARCH

A Pointed arches, ogival arch, or gothic arch is an arch with a pointed crown, whose two curving sides meet at a relatively sharp angle at the top of the arch. this architectural element was particularly important in gothic architecture.





STAINED GLASS

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- The basilica retains stained glass of many periods including exceptional modern glass, and a set of 12 misericords.
- The stained-glass windows of Notre-dame particularly the three windows, are among the most famous feature of the cathedral. the west rose window, over the portals, was the first and smallest of the roses in Notre- dame. it is 9.6 meters in diameter, and was made in a about 1225, with the piece es of glass set in a thick circular atone frame. none of the original glass remains in this window, it was recreated in the 19th century.

VAULTED CEILINGS

- Ribbed vaulting is another art form during the gothic period because the pointed arch results involved barrel vaults-arches placed parallel to one another and supported the rounded roof. These vaulted ceilings used the pointed arch technology to spread and distribute the weight and force from the upper floors..
 - They allowed ceilings to be taller than they were before, providing an impression of height and elegance. As a result of the force distribution within the vaulting ceilings, the vaults could be constructed in different sizes and shapes.







LIGHTING CONCEPT

BASIC CONCEPT -

The issue of lighting in libraries is one that is still discussed and debate	d
coday.	

- Well-designed and carefully positioned <u>lighting</u> makes patrons feel good and comfortable in their surroundings; bad lighting creates problems for patrons when they are reading, studying or searching for books and may keep their visit to the library short.
- Lighting can even have a negative impact on library staff too. If poor lighting harms the ability of the staff to function, which can happen if lighting creates glare and heavy shadows, the library is likely to be unpopular. A library with insufficient or poorly designed lighting is far from welcoming

INDIRECT LIGHT :

- ☐ Indirect lighting uses fluorescent or metal halide lamps to up light a light color ceiling;
- ☐ The resulting reflected light is inherently very soft, shadow-free, and low-glare. Indirect lighting works well for both paper-based and computer tasks in rooms where the ceiling height is at least 9'-6" and preferably more than 10'-0".

DIRECT LIGHT:

- Direct lighting uses down lights to illuminate the reading tables.
- ☐ The down lights can be as small as 6" diameter fixtures with compact fluorescent or metal halide lamps and parabolic cones, or they can be linear or rectangular fluorescent fixtures with parabolic louvers.
- The parabolic shape of the cones and louvers prevents seeing the lamps at shallow viewing angles and re-directs the light so it is less likely to be reflected in computer screens. The parabolic cones or louvers should be made of aluminum, not plastic, and they should have a "semi-specular" finish to reduce the visibility of dirt or fingerprints.

DAY LIGHT -

- ☐ Effective use of day light can reduce energy consumption, and make the library feel warm and comfortable when reading. however uncontrolled day light can be a source of glare and can damage sensitive materials.
- North facing windows or terraces allow in day light while excluding

THE TYPES OF LIGHTING USED IN MY DESIGN

The availability of artificial light, it has become possible to design library buildings that are larger and can be open for longer. The consequence is that intelligent day lighting has frequently been ignored – the very availability of artificial light seems to be prompting its conspicuous consumption.
