





INTRODUCTION (DPS KINDERGARTEN SCHOOL)

DPS Kindergarten School in Bangalore, a project by Khosla Associates, experiments with a form of sustainability involving screening of sunshine with traditional terra cotta jails and natural ventilation and lighting. The building, based on a concrete module with corrugated sheet metal walls, proclaims a democratic model of schooling. The current kindergarten facility has 25 classrooms, and with 40 children a class, a total strength of 1000.

The efficiencies of designing and constructing a building so rapidly had to be balanced with what we believed in; creating a warm, playful and welcoming environment for these young children that would be filled with natural light and ventilation.

ABOUT PROJECT

- The primary challenge was to design and complete construction of the first 35,000 sqft. The efficiencies of designing and constructing a building so rapidly had to be balanced with what we believed in; creating a warm, playful and welcoming environment for these young children that would be filled with natural light and ventilation.
- the school's most important group activities take place: assemblies and games, in a paved area with playground equipment.
- Creating an efficient modular system that we could use as building blocks. We looked at the basic module of a 700 sft classroom (35ft x 20 ft.)



CLASSROOMS

- In the middle of the floor plan is a concrete stair case linking the ground floor with the first floor. A massive element colored red on the sides.




OUTDOOR KID PLAYING AREA

- The central open to sky court that runs the entire length of the building is the soul of the school and facilities learning outside the class room.



- A modular concrete framework provides a standard size for the classrooms, which in some places are stacked to create a second storey
- interlocking brick used in open courtyard.
- Corrugated metal wall on all corridors wall.



- That could be repeated horizontally, or stacked one atop the other. The classrooms on either side flank an 8ft wide single loaded corridor and open up to a central open- to-sky courtyard.
- The vernacular terracotta jails (shading and ventilation screens used traditionally in India) that wrap around parts of the building and are included on both sides of each classroom to facilitate adequate cross ventilation from NE to SW.
- The jail cut down the sun especially on the western face of the building where we have effectively used them in breakout areas.

- Constructed from two standard types of perforated brick, these decorative screens.

Furniture – wooden and trapezium plastic furniture.



- Near the main entrance is an open amphitheater which is used for activities such as morning prayers, dramas and performance.


- This made us repurpose the roof of the entire building into a sloping garden interconnecting each floor. The flat area of the roof is used as a cycling track

THEME-POST-MODERN STYLE

HISTORY OF MODERN STYLE

- Modern design is part of the larger movement of modernism. Modernism is usually dated back to around the end of the 19th century and early of 20th centuries.
- It is categorized by abstract thinking that deviated from realism, and renaissance beliefs in previous eras.
- Modernism in art and architecture, in particular, was popular during the 1940s to 1980s.
- During this era, homes designed in the modern style consisted of smooth, straight lines; open floor plans; large glass windows; geometrics shapes and patterns; man-made materials; and natural elements that showed an integration with the outdoors.

ELEMENTS OF POST-MODERN STYLE

CLEAN LINES:

The design styles preceding modern design were [Gothic, Renaissance, and Victorian styles](#). They incorporated heavy textures, ornamentation, and plenty of dark and dramatic elements. Modern design rejected these aspects in favor of clean, straight lines, uncluttered spaces, and an overall lack of fussiness.

NEUTRAL COLORS

Post Modern style steers clear of bright colors in favor of a monochromatic, neutral color palette. Think white, beige, gray, black, and pastel tones.

NATURAL MATERIALS

The modern design era ushered in new materials from which to construct furniture. Steel, molded plywood, and plastic were all used both instead of or alongside wood. For modern designers, the goal was to strike a balance between pure function and aesthetics.



LOW AND LONG FURNITURE

Long furniture pieces situated low to the ground can give your home a modern look if they're also made from natural materials like unpainted wood or metal. Leather and fabric upholstery, wood veneers (such as those used to create the classically mid-century modern Eames chair), glass, chrome, steel, and concrete are also popular finishes for modern furniture.

OPEN FLOOR PLAN

Use furniture instead of walls to differentiate between the spaces of an open plan space.

PRINCIPLES OF POST-MODERN STYLE

BALANCE

The definition of balance describes it as the harmonious arrangement of components – it ensures that no single element in a room overpowers another in terms of visual weight or dominance.

CONTRAST

A contrast refers to **colour combinations of darker and lighter shades**. Contrast is when two or more elements are placed together such that their opposite characteristics become prominent.

PROPORTION

Proportion in interior design refers to the balance between design elements including **size, shape, colour and texture**.

PATTERN

Pattern is defined as a repeating element or design that produces obvious directional movements. Patterns come in all **shapes and forms**.

MOVEMENT

Movement is the path the viewer's eye takes through the work of art, often to focal areas.




RHYTHM






Fig. 2 Receptionist's workstation/desk height.








Fig. 2 Basic U-shaped workstation.




Fig. 1 Executive desk/visitor seating.




Fig. 2 Optimum shelving conditions for teenagers.





Fig. 3 Optimum shelving conditions for children.
