



Lucknow has a warm subtropical climate with cool, dry winters from December to February and dry, hot summers from April to June. The rainy season is from mid-June to mid-September, when Lucknow gets an average rainfall of 1010 mm (40 in) mostly from the south-west monsoon winds. In winter the maximum temperature is around 21 degrees Celsius and the minimum is in the 3 to 4 degrees Celsius range. Fog is quite common from late December to late January. Summers can be quite hot with temperatures rising to the 40 to 45 degree Celsius range, the average highs being in the high 30's.




PRECIPITATION GRAPH

The project at SMR Jaipuria School involved the **expansion** and **refurbishment** of the **original structure** that was built in **1992**. Through a tactical refurbishment of the existing structure.

The **design brief** called for the **accommodation** of **additional** programs such as **classrooms, activity rooms, large dance halls, a research lab, library and breakout spaces** along with the refurbishment of the school's interiors. While the expansion was earmarked for the open space adjoining the school. This approach would help utilise existing circulation cores, and the need for resource-intensive additions while leaving the proposed site for **expansion** as open **playgrounds** for students.



The walls around the courtyard have also been transformed with a birch ply framework and low-height chalkboards that showcase the students' artwork. These interventions together work to create two vibrant cores that enhance social interaction among the students and act as the heart of the institution.

The courtyards also form a vital part of the complex, bringing ample natural light and ventilation into the blocks.

The corridors form a unifying element throughout the school and are transformed into spaces where students can express themselves through drawings, display boards and artworks. Care is taken to ensure that chalkboards and display boards are at an accessible height for children, making it an inclusive and engaging environment



The library and research lab were also redesigned with furniture and storage units ergonomically designed specifically for children.

There are separate HVAC units for each space, enabling specialised attention to light ventilation and temperature. The school was also equipped with specialised 'smart' classrooms that are fully enabled with IT and AV. Classrooms were fitted LED light fixtures and high performance fenestration.

The refurbishment also entailed the revamp of the interiors of the administrative block to create a playful, yet sophisticated ambience to encapsulate the ideology of the school. One of the ways this has been done is with the introduction of colourful and dynamic white, blue and orange. The vibrant ceiling is paired with monochromes used in the carpeted flooring and furniture. The walls are panelled used as displays for trophies and boards highlighting students achievements.



INTRODUCTION:

Nandanam, meaning 'Garden' in Sanskrit, is the second kindergarten in Auroville located in the center field. This creche cum kindergarten accommodates up to 60 children of age varying between 2.5 years to 7 years.

The main ideology recognized in this kindergarten is that the foremost principle of teaching is that you can't teach anything and the teacher is a helper and a guide, not an instructor or taskmaster. With these principles being followed, the kindergarten works on the integral development of children, focusing on their physical, mental, vital, and psychic development in accordance with The Mother's and Sri Aurobindo's guidelines.


IDEOLOGY:



Section showing play of wind




Plan with climatic response




INTERIOR SPACES:




Activity plan:

INTRODUCTION:

The project forms part of the new Maidenhill development at Newton Mearns, southwest of Glasgow. A completely new neighborhood, comprising more than 800 homes, is being created with the new two stream primary school and early years facility sitting at the heart of the masterplan.

The unusual condition of school being built in parallel with neighboring houses has given us an opportunity To design not only a new learning center , but also create a focus for the new community. A “green spine” runs Through the development, connecting the new dwellings to a central landscaped pathway which feeds into the school.

IDEOLOGY:

The design focuses on providing spaces which encourage children's curiosity and create a learning landscape enriched with 'play' elements and natural forms.







- The Science & Technology zone plays a key role in encouraging children to interact with their environment through STEM related subjects.
- Central atrium: school organized around a central atrium ‘heart’ space, which contains a wealth of interactivity including science, performance, music, technology, library, art, storytelling and play.
- Creative activity space: The central ‘heartspace’ around flexible learning scenarios ranging from cosy ‘wall pocket’ snugs and ‘birdhouse’ hideaway for individual and paired learning, through to large auditorium types spaces for group work. An internal climbing wall or ‘Maidenhill’ provide scope for high energy activity.
- Nursery: Circular in form, filled with natural light designed around a central ‘treehouse’ that’s elevated above the central dining and performance space.
- The theme of nature: permeates throughout the school and is reflected in furniture, materials, shapes, colours and graphics.
- Outdoor activity space: Design of the outdoor spaces integrate the concept of ‘natural play’. This environment encourages children to engage with the four essential life elements; earth, air, fire and water.
- Energy efficient: Low energy emittance lights and low water use fittings are applied throughout the school.
